DRAFT HURSTVILLE CITY CENTRE URBAN DESIGN STRATEGY

Council, at its meeting on 7 August 2017, considered a report and resolved to publicly exhibit the draft Hurstville City Centre Urban Design Strategy (draft Strategy). The draft Strategy has been prepared by consultants SJB Architects and applies to land within the Hurstville City Centre.

The key objectives of the draft Strategy are:

- To reinforce the role of Hurstville as a Gateway to southern Sydney;
- To strengthen the use of public and active transport to and within the centre;
- To enhance and strengthen the identity of the centre;
- To improve pedestrian connectivity and movement; and
- To provide block by block planning controls for the centre

For ease of reference, fact sheets have been prepared for the blocks where changes are proposed under the draft Strategy and are available on Council's website.
