Requirements of Concurrence, Integrated & Other Government Authorities

- 2. Electricity Supply An application is required to be made to Ausgrid for a network connection. This may require the network to be extended or its capacity augmented. Evidence of this application being lodged with Ausgrid is required to be provided to the Certifying Authority prior to the issue of a Construction Certificate. For further details, you are advised to contact Ausgrid on 13 13 65 or www.ausgrid.com.au (Business and Commercial Services).
- 3. Sydney Water Tap in [™] The approved plans must be submitted to a Sydney Water Tap in [™] to determine whether the development application will

affect Sydney Water's sewer and water mains, stormwater drains and/or easements, and if further requirements need to be met. The approved plans will be appropriately endorsed. For details please refer to 'Plumbing, building and developing' section of Sydney Water's web site at www.sydneywater.com.au then see 'Building', or telephone 13000 TAP IN (1300 082 746). The Certifying Authority must ensure that a Tap in agent has appropriately stamped the plans prior to the issue of the Construction Certificate.

Prior to the Issue of a Construction Certificate

- 4. Access for Persons with a Disability Access and sanitary facilities for persons with disabilities must be provided to the premises/building in accordance with the requirements of the Premises Standards, the Building Code of Australia, and AS 1428.1. Details must be submitted with the Construction Certificate Application for approval.
- 5. Commonwealth Disability (Access to Premises) Standard The Commonwealth Disability (Access to Premises Buildings) Standards 2010 (the Premises Standards) applies to all applications (i.e. Construction Certificate). This requires any new building, part of a building and the affected part of the existing building to comply with the Premises Standards, the Building Code of Australia and AS 1428.
- 6. **Fees to be paid** The fees listed in the table below must be paid in accordance with the conditions of this consent and Council's adopted Fees and Charges applicable at the time of payment (available at www.georgesriver.nsw.gov.au).

Payments must be made prior to the issue of the Construction Certificate or prior to the commencement of work (if there is no associated Construction Certificate).

Please contact Council prior to the payment of Section 7.11 Contributions to determine whether the amounts have been indexed from that indicated below in this consent and the form of payment that will be accepted by Council.

Council will only accept Bank Cheque or Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) for transaction values of \$500,000 or over. Council must be contacted prior to payment to determine correct total amount to be paid and bank account details (if applicable).

The fees and charges above are subject to change and are as set out in the version of Council's Schedule of Fees and Charges or as required by other Government Authorities, applicable at the time of payment.

7. Waste Management Plan - A Waste Management Plan incorporating all requirements in respect of the provision of waste storage facilities, removal of all materials from the site that are the result of site clearing, extraction, and, or demolition works and the designated Waste Management Facility shall be submitted to the Certifying Authority prior to the issue of any Construction Certificate.

During Construction

- 8. **Site sign Soil & Erosion Control Measures** Prior to the commencement of works (including demolition and excavation), a durable site sign, issued by Council in conjunction with this consent, must be erected in a prominent location on site. The site sign warns of the penalties which apply to pollution, storing materials on road or footpath and breaches of the conditions relating to erosion and sediment controls. The sign must remain in a prominent location on site up until the completion of all site and building works.
- 9. **Hours of construction for demolition and building work** Unless authorised by Council:
 - a. Building construction and delivery of material hours are restricted to 7.00am to 5.00pm (inclusive) Monday to Saturday and no work on Sundays and Public Holidays.
 - b. Demolition and excavation works are restricted to 8.00am to 5.00pm (inclusive) Monday to Friday only. Excavation work includes the use of any excavation machinery and the use of jackhammers, rock breakers, excavators, loaders and the like, regardless of whether the activities disturb or alter the natural state of the existing ground stratum or are breaking up/removing materials from the site.
- 10. Cost of work to be borne by the applicant The applicant shall bear the cost of all works associated with the construction of the development that occurs on Council property. Care must be taken to protect Council's roads, including the made footway, kerbs, etc., and, where plant and vehicles enter the site, the footway shall be protected against damage by deep-sectioned timber members laid crosswise, held together by hoop iron straps and chamfered at their ends. This construction shall be maintained in a state of good repair and condition throughout the course of construction.
- 11. **Obstruction of Road or Footpath** The use of the road or footpath for the storage of any building materials, waste materials, temporary toilets, waste or skip bins, or any other matter is not permitted unless separately approved by Council under Section 138 of the Roads Act 1993 and/or under Section 68 of the Local Government Act 1993. Penalty infringement Notices may be issued for any offences and severe penalties apply.

Prior to the issue of the Occupation Certificate

- 12. **Acoustic Certification** Prior to the issue of any Occupation Certificate, a suitably qualified acoustic consultant shall certify that the operation of the premises and plant equipment shall not give rise to a sound pressure level at any affected premises that exceeds the acoustic criteria established by the Acoustic Report required by a condition of this consent. The development shall at all times comply with these noise levels post occupation.
- 13. **Acoustic Compliance -** Prior to the issue of any Occupation Certificate, a report prepared by a suitably qualified acoustic consultant must be submitted to the PCA certifying that the construction has incorporated the recommendations in the DA Acoustic Report titled DA Acoustic Assessment (Place of Worship) 7 Rickard Road South Hurstville Prepared by Acoustic Logic dated 13 August 2020.
- 14. **Noise Domestic Air conditioner and Heat pump water heaters (less than 450mm from boundary)** Prior to the issue of any Occupation Certificate, a report prepared by a professional acoustic engineer must be submitted to the PCA to certify that the design and construction of the air conditioner / heat pump water heaters shall not produce a sound level exceeding 5 dB(A) above the ambient background level at the closest neighbouring boundary between the hours of 8:00am and 10:00pm on Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays and between the hours of 7:00am and 10:00pm on any other day. Outside the specified hours, the sound level output for the running of air conditioner shall not exceed the ambient background noise level.
- 15. **Allocation of car parking spaces** Car parking associated with the development is to be allocated as follows:
 - (a) Visitors: Four (4) car parking spaces compliant with AS2890.1.

Operational Conditions (Ongoing)

- 16. **Maximum number of lodgers** The maximum number of lodgers at the premises is to be restricted to seven (7).
- 17. Maximum number of people on the premises at any one time (during operating hours) is restricted to twenty (20).
- 18. Maximum number of people during monthly committee meetings is five (5).
- 19. **Noise Control** The use of the premises must not give rise to the transmission of offensive noise to any place of different occupancy. Offensive noise is defined in the <u>Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997</u> (as amended).
- 20. **Acoustic recommendations** The development control measures outlined in the Acoustic Assessment (Place of Worship) Report prepared by Acoustic Logic dated 13 August 2020 to be implemented to minimise any potential noise impacts from the proposed place of worship.

- 21. Final Acoustic Report - Verification of Noise report - Within three months from the issue of an Occupation Certificate, an acoustic assessment is to be carried out by an appropriately qualified acoustic consultant, in accordance with the EPA's Industrial Noise http://www.epa.nsw.gov.au/resources/noise/ind_noise.pdf and submitted to Council for consideration. This report should include but not be limited to, details verifying that the noise control measures as recommended in the acoustic report (DA Acoustic Assessment (Place of Worship) - 7 Rickard Road South Hurstville - Prepared by Acoustic Logic - dated 13 August 2020) are effective in attenuating noise to an acceptable noise level and that the use is not calculated to give rise to 'offensive noise' as defined under the provision of Protection of the Environment Operation Act 1997 the http://www.legislation.nsw.gov.au/ (as amended).
- 22. **Hours of operation** The approved hours of operation shall be restricted to the following:
 - Visiting hours are between 8am and 6pm, 7 days a week.
 - Maximum number of persons at any one time: Twenty (20)
- 23. **Lighting General Nuisance** Any lighting on the site shall be designed so as not to cause a nuisance to other residences in the area or to motorists on nearby roads and to ensure no adverse impact on the amenity of the surrounding area by light overspill or glare.
 - Flashing, moving or intermittent lights or signs are prohibited.
- 24. **Activities and storage of goods outside buildings** There shall be no activities including storing or depositing of any goods or maintenance to any machinery external to the building with the exception of waste receptacles.
- 25. **Annual Fire Safety Statement** The owner of the building premises must ensure the Council is given an annual fire safety statement in relation to each essential fire safety measure implemented in the building. The annual fire safety statement must be given:
 - (a) Within 12 months after the date on which the fire safety certificate was received.
 - (b) Subsequent annual fire safety statements are to be given within 12 months after the last such statement was given.
 - (c) An annual fire safety statement is to be given in or to the effect of Clause 181 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2000.
 - (d) A copy of the statement is to be given to the Commissioner of Fire & Rescue NSW, and a further copy is to be prominently displayed in the building.
- 26. **Acoustic recommendations** The development control measures outlined in the Acoustic Assessment (Place of Worship) Report prepared by Acoustic Logic dated 13 August 2020 to be implemented to minimise any potential noise

impacts from the proposed place of worship.

- 27. **Maintenance of Landscaping** All trees and plants forming part of the landscaping must be maintained. Maintenance includes watering, weeding, removal of rubbish from tree bases, fertilizing, pest and disease control, replacement of dead or dying plants and any other operations required to maintain healthy trees, plants and turfed areas.
- 28. **Amenity of the neighbourhood** The implementation of this development shall not adversely affect the amenity of the neighbourhood or interfere unreasonably with the comfort or repose of a person who is outside the premises by reason of the emission or discharge of noise, fumes, vapour, odour, steam, soot, dust, waste water, waste products, grit, oil or other harmful products.
- 29. **Amenity of the neighbourhood** The implementation of this development shall not adversely affect the amenity of the neighbourhood or interfere unreasonably with the comfort or repose of a person who is outside the premises by reason of the emission or discharge of noise, fumes, vapour, odour, steam, soot, dust, waste water, waste products, grit, oil or other harmful products.

Operational Requirements Under the Environmental Planning & Assessment Act 1979

30. **Review of Determination -** Section 8.2 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act confers on an applicant who is dissatisfied with the determination of the application the right to lodge an application with Council for a review of such determination. Any such review must however be completed within 6 months from its determination. Should a review be contemplated sufficient time should be allowed for Council to undertake public notification and other processes involved in the review of the determination.

<u>Note</u>: Review provisions do not apply to Complying Development, Designated Development, State Significant Development, Integrated Development or any application determined by the Sydney South Planning Panel or the Land & Environment Court.

- 31. **Appeal Rights -** Part 8 (Reviews and appeals) of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 confers on an applicant who is dissatisfied with the determination of the application a right of appeal to the Land and Environment Court of New South Wales.
- 32. **Lapsing of Consent -** This consent will lapse unless the development is physically commenced within 5 years from the Date of Operation of this consent, in accordance with Section 4.53 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 as amended.
- 33. **Noise** Noise related conditions Council will generally enforce noise related conditions in accordance with the Noise Guide for Local Government (http://www.environment.nsw.gov.au/noise/nglg.htm) and the Industrial Noise Guidelines (http://www.environment.nsw.gov.au/noise/industrial.htm) publish

by the Department of Environment and Conservation. Other state government authorities also regulate the Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997.
