What is Garden Waste?

Garden waste is any material from your garden including:

- Cuttings
- Lawn clippings
- Branches
- Weeds
- Leaves
- Other unwanted plant materials.

Why is it a problem?

Dumping green waste from your garden in bushland areas can:

- introduce weeds
- compete with and smother native seedlings
- affects native animals who rely on native plants for food and/or shelter
- poses a fire threat to people, houses and bushland
- it looks unsightly and can even affect land values

Green waste collection

Council provides a green waste collection service for grass clippings, leaves/twigs, small branches, flowers, weeds and prunings.

Bushcare
