

Overview

In June 2023, Georges River Council held the third successful, Un[contained] Arts Festival which attracted over 40,000 people. Un[contained] Arts Festival, is returning to Kogarah in July 2024.

This festival enlivens Belgrave Street, Kogarah and increases the cultural vibrancy of the area. It disrupts what people think of as 'art', sparks curiosity and generates a sense of play in the community, bringing new contemporary artists to the area, and providing a platform for local artists to showcase their works.

This opportunity would suit those who have a keen interest in art and/or culture, event management and enjoys interacting with the general public.

The Un[contained] Arts Festival will take place on the 19, 20, and 21 July 2024.

Responsibilities

As a volunteer at the Un[contained] Arts Festival you will have the opportunity to invigilate and provide interpretation for artworks where necessary. Volunteers will be rostered from 4.00pm to 10.00pm on either the 19, 20 and/or 21 July 2024. There will be an induction before your shift.

Tasks will include:

- Ensuring artworks and installations are not touched or photographed by visitors as indicated
- Ensuring all interactive components are functioning
- Providing general information to the public
- Providing crowd control/line management
- Notifying onsite staff if anything requires their attention

Skills required:

- Effective communication skills
- Ability to work independently
- Working With Children Check (free to obtain for volunteers)
